ABOUT A NEW BRAIN

Based on the real life experience of composer William Finn (whose other shows include *Falsettos* and *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*), *A New Brain* tells the story of Gordon Schwinn, a composer who discovers he has a life-threatening brain disease. Gordon winds up in the hospital, surrounded by his maritime-enthusiast lover, his mother, a co-worker, the doctor, and the nurses, each of whom has their own quirks and neuroses. Gordon's joy returning to his work is an important reminder of the healing power of art and is especially timely as we return to theatermaking post-COVID. With a small cast and a sung-through score, this show is a great opportunity for performers of all backgrounds to tell a story that is energetic, sardonic, comical and — most importantly — fun.

CHARACTERS

Gordon Michael Schwinn: A lovable but sarcastic composer

Mr. Bungee: The slightly tyrannical director/producer/star of his own children's television show

Mimi Schwinn: Gordon's loving yet unstable mother

Rhoda: Gordon's agent and best-friend

Roger Delli-Bovi: Gordon's charming and affectionate boyfriend

Richard: A kind and compassionate nurse

Lisa: A homeless lady

Waitress/Nancy D: The waitress is overbearing; Nancy is a mean nurse

Dr. Jafar Berensteiner: An unsympathetic doctor

The Minister: A somewhat clueless man of the cloth at the hospital

Note on casting: The roles of Gordon and Mimi have already been cast. Additionally, we aim to be inclusive of actors of any gender-identity and will consider any actor for any part! We will have a space on our audition form for you to tell us what genders you feel comfortable portraying on stage, and please reach out to Ian (<u>ian.berlin@yale.edu</u>) if there is anything we can do to make our production welcoming and inclusive of your gender.

AUDITION PROCESS

Our auditions will be held from **1pm-3pm on Friday**, **12/3**, **2:30pm-5pm on Saturday**, **12/4**, **and from 2-3pm on Sunday 12/5**. If you are able, please try to sign up for a slot on Friday or Saturday, but we'll have a few slots on Sunday if that doesn't work for you! If none of the available slots on our YCA page work for you, please reach out to Ellie (<u>ellie.burke@yale.edu</u>) and we'll find a time that works! For your addition, please prepare a **32-bar cut of a musical theater song written after 1980**. 32-bars isn't a hard cutoff, just try to prepare about a minute of music to sing. 1980 also isn't a hard cutoff, we just want to hear a modern musical theater piece (i.e. not Golden Age). Please bring a copy of the sheet music for your song, ideally in the key you will be singing it in. Peter will also do a few simple vocal warmups with you to get a feel for your voice, but this is not something you should worry about preparing for.

CALLBACK PROCESS

For some roles, we may want to see you sing some material from the show. For that, we'll have you come to callbacks on **Saturday**, **December 11th**. We'll send out any music we'd like to hear you do in advance, though we'll also make sure we take some time that day to teach it to you, so don't worry about perfecting it on your own! This is also a great opportunity for us to see you interact with other performers, so you may be asked to do a scene or song with another performer.

We cannot wait to see you at auditions, and please don't hesitate to reach out to anyone on the team to answer any questions you may have about the show, the process, auditions, or anything else! Break a leg!!!
