#### What?

This 1997 Pulitzer Prize-winning memory play follows the story of a young woman as she comes of age in rural Maryland during the 1960s and 1970s. In a series of nonlinear flashbacks, by turns funny and harrowing, she retraces her driving lessons with a charismatic older man, which extend beyond simply learning the rules of the road. A versatile Greek chorus provides context, atmosphere, and dysfunctional family dynamics.

### Time Commitment

Because this production has a relatively small cast, all actors should expect a significant time commitment. During the first five weeks of rehearsal, plan to rehearse approximately 5–7 hours per week. In the final three weeks leading up to opening weekend, rehearsals will increase to ~8–10 hours per week. During tech week, be prepared to commit 4–6 hours per day to the production. # The Cast

The role of Li'l Bit will be played by Alice Kasdan. The other four roles are open for casting!

**PECK**: Attractive man in his forties. Despite being a character who is both deeply troubled and troubling, he could be played by an actor one might cast in the role of Atticus in *To Kill a Mockingbird*—wise, earnest, compassionate, paternal. [This role includes intimacy with Li'l Bit and Female Greek Chorus.]

MALE GREEK CHORUS: Plays Grandfather, Waiter, High School Boys. Crude, snarky, dark-humored.

**FEMALE GREEK CHORUS**: Plays Mother, Aunt Mary, High School Girls. Unhappy, outspoken, norm-enforcing. [This role includes intimacy with Peck.]

**TEENAGE GREEK CHORUS**: Plays Grandmother, High School Girls, and the voice of eleven-year-old Li'l Bit. Frank, old-fashioned—and as the young Li'l Bit, very vulnerable.

# FAQ and Audition Details

### What do I need to prepare before the audition?

First, fill out this <u>AUDITION FORM</u> before the audition. Then, sign up for a ten-minute slot on the YCA website or send us a self-tape by 11:59pm on Thursday, December 4 at <u>learntodriveyale@gmail.com</u>.

Please prepare with sides for the characters that you would like to be considered for. All the sides are linked here in the <u>Audition Sides folder</u>. No need to be fully memorized at all! Just become familiar enough that you can deliver the material confidently and showcase your abilities with as little stress as possible.

#### What will the audition look like?

On the day of the audition, we will first introduce the team and then have you introduce yourself. Next, we will dive into the sides. We may ask you to read cold from a different scene. We are looking for grounded, character-driven performances.

Afterwards, we will make sure there is time for you to ask any questions you may have! We cannot wait to meet you!
