



Hi! Thank you so much for your interest in Pippin. Welcome to the audition packet — here you'll find all the information you need to get involved. Following a traveling troupe of actors as they tell the story of medieval prince Pippin searching for meaning in life, Pippin is a modern classic of the American musical theater. Written by Stephen Schwartz (Wicked, Godspell) and originally developed alongside Bob Fosse, this show features a groovy 70s score and opportunities for comic actors, dramatic actors, vocalists, and dancers alike. We welcome auditionees of any level of performance experience (including none!), and there are plenty of opportunities to get involved behind the scenes as well. The role of Pippin will be played by Elsie Harrington for her Acting Thesis as part of the Theater, Dance and Performance major, and we are looking to cast genderneutrally, meaning that auditionees of all genders will be considered for all roles, unless an actor expresses a casting preference.

PIPPIN | this role has been cast. eager to prove himself. idealistic, a bit naïve, playful but sincere. Staged intimacy and combat.

LEADING PLAYER | strong-willed, charismatic, persistent. leader of the troupe and keeper of the story.

CHARLES demanding, conceited, determined. King of France and Holy Roman Emperor, husband to Fastrada, father to Pippin and Lewis. Staged combat.

FASTRADA | cunning queen, wife to Charles, mother to Lewis, stepmother to Pippin.

BERTHE | wise, raunchy, a free spirit. Pippin's grandmother.

CATHERINE | single mother and farmer. independent, a hopeless romantic. mother to Theo, love interest to Pippin. *Staged intimacy*.

LEWIS | flamboyant, audacious, mama's boy. Pippin's stepbrother. *Staged* combat.

THEO curious, earnest, stubborn. Catherine's son. loves his pet duck.

ENSEMBLE | chameleon-like players, born to entertain. heightened, a lowbrow sophistication. *Staged intimacy and combat.* 





A traveling troupe of players gathers to tell the story of Pippin, son of King Charlemagne, a young college grad searching for meaning in life. Helmed by an enigmatic Leading Player, the troupe corrals around the actress playing Pippin, who's not interested in sticking to the script.

As Pippin tries on various roles—soldier, king, farmer, husband, father we explore the performance of gender and identity, and play with the tenuous boundary of the fourth wall.

Estimated weekly time commitment: ~2 hour | Depiction of war, mentions of sex and suicide. Some intimacy and stage combat, both to be staged in conjunction with Fight and Intimacy coordinators.



Please arrive 5-10 minutes early for your scheduled slot!

#### **Vocal Auditions** (in-person):

Please prepare 32-bars (~90 seconds) of a song of your choosing. Selections do not have to be memorized, but you should be comfortable making acting choices if asked to sing your excerpt in a different style. A short vocal warmup will be provided.

Songs can be performed a cappella, with a karaoke track or with piano accompaniment. If you would like piano accompaniment, please send a PDF of your music to voshimi.kimura@vale.edu OR bring a physical copy to your audition. If using a karaoke track, please make sure your audios are ready to go to keep the audition process running smoothly.


### If submitting a self tape (video recording):

Please also include a recording of yourself singing along to this vocal range (here for higher voices, here for lower voices). You only need to record from when the test actually begins.

Please arrive in comfortable clothing and shoes, ready to move!

Specific rooms in 220 York TBA. Check back on YCA Page. Dance Calls: Silliman Dance Studio, in the basement. Go in as if you are going to the dining hall, but turn right in front of the second set of doors. (Don't go into the lobby.) Take the stairs down, and immediately turn right and go straight until you get to the studio. The buttery counter will be to your right. (Take the elevator down if you do not have swipe access to Silliman.)



If you can't make it to an in-person audition, you can still audition by sending us a recording of your audition materials (anything you aren't able to perform for us inperson) before midnight on Saturday night, August 31st. Please **fill out the audition form** and attach your video when prompted. If you come across any problems with this part of the form, you can send your videos to producers Emily and Thomas at <a href="maily.patrick@yale.edu">emily.patrick@yale.edu</a> and <a href="maily.patrick@yale.edu">thomas.kannam@yale.edu</a>. You can record using your phone or laptop, and just like with an in-person audition, feel free to read from music/lyrics— just make sure we can see your face clearly in the video.
