Who?

What?

Avant-garde playwright Con wrestles with both his own identity as a struggling, unsuccessful artist and his complex relationship with his mother Emma, a renowned soap opera actress whose work he finds shallow and meaningless, and her love for him nonexistent. He also harbors a deep love for his childhood friend Nina, but she instead pursues the affections of Trig, a wildly successful and talented writer and, most disastrously, Emma's lover. When the mother and son find themselves entangled in each other's lives in a way that they never have before, they are forced not only to confront the role that love plays in their lives, but also their purpose as artists, and how to make some sort ofa meaning out of a world that is so clearly, painfully "unfair."

With numerous love triangles, affairs, betrayals, and intentional breakings of the fourth wall, this comedic modern rendition of Anton Chekhov's *The Seagull* asks the audience to question why we create art, and what the purpose of love truly is.

- All auditionees (whether self-tape or in-person) are required to fill out <u>this audition form</u> and are encouraged to fill out this<u>optional demographics form</u>, which is only for Dramat Outreach purposes and has no bearing on casting whatsoever.

- In-person auditionees can sign up for auditions here and should arrive 5 minutes early. Printouts will be provided (no need to carry your own) and monologues do <u>not</u> need to be memorized.

- Selected auditionees will be given callback offers for specific roles on 9/1. All details/sides will be provided over email and the callbacks will be in-person.

Character descriptions:

All roles are open to actors of all races/ethnicities, gender identities, and experience levels Time commitment: 12hr/week for Con/Nina/Trig, 10 hr/week for others, up to 20 hrs during tech We will be working with a professional fight & intimacy coordinator

CON: The protagonist, a struggling playwright. Cynical. Angry at the world. Wants to create "new forms" of theater, but has only achieved a mediocre level of success. There is something dark and deeply unsettling within him, but it's just below the surface and he keeps it under control until he absolutely no longer can. *Content warnings: Talks about suicide, Holds a gun, consensual intimacy (kiss) with Nina*

NINA: Con's love interest. Wants to become an actress. Had a difficult childhood with abusive, controlling parents, and is thus obsessed with the idea of fame and widespread love. Our modern, more realistic rendition of the muse or manic pixie girl.

Content warnings: Consensual intimacy with Con and Trig, partial nudity (stripping down to bra)

EMMA: Con's mother. A famous actress. Jaded, jealous, and overbearing. Had Con when she was 19, and struggled with being a good parent. Seems to lack love for everyone but herself, but in reality has developed a tough shell because of the hardship she's had. Boss bitch, creates and runs the energy of every room she enters. *Content warnings: Consensual intimacy (kiss) with Trig*

TRIG: Emma's lover. A narcissistic, selfish, hedonistic, and extremely famous novelist. A true romantic, and a somewhat pseudo-intellectual. Most of all, dedicated to his craft; he is that author that keeps a little notepad and pen on him just in case inspiration strikes at random. *Content warnings: Consensual intimacy (kiss) with Nina and Emma*

DEV: Con's best friend. In love with Mash. At his core, a true loser, and he knows it, but he doesn't fight it. Unintentionally funny, and perhaps the most honest of the ensemble.

MASH: At heart a musician, but professionally Emma's cook. Manipulative. Emo. Hates the world, but can't help but love Conrad.

SORN: Emma's brother. A doctor. Old, and slowly dying, but aware of the fact. In many ways, Con's protector and spiritual guide.
